Welcome our two new boys who came home to Rafiki in November. We are especially grateful for God's protection and provision for four-year-old Jackson. He was being cared for by his fourteen-year-old sister and thirteen-year-old brother after their parents died. Jackson hadn't eaten anything the two days before we took him for a medical physical. He was listless when we picked him up, but much more alert and talkative after we fed him. He and four-year-old Fabrice are both doing well since coming to Rafiki.

Update on our daughter, Sarah

Sarah is settling into a routine in Texas with her grandmother, but still battles pain in her hip. Her attitude in general is happy but she isn't able to stay awake very many hours during the day. Her pain is more manageable after a neurostimulator was surgically placed in her spine, but she still requires medication in doses large enough to make her too sleepy to start college yet.

- Wisdom for God's choice of an additional three girls and one boy, two-to-five years of age.
- The Rafiki Mothers, children, staff, and ROS to apply God's Word in our everyday lives as we study the Book of Acts.
- Circumcisions to be done carefully without complication for five of our boys during the Christmas school break—Daniel, Pierre, Blaise, Faustin, and Alex.

Please pray for Sarah to recover fully and be able to start college in August 2014.

Also pray for all medical expenses, not covered by insurance, to be met and for Doug and Carolyn to have completed funding for our next two-year term

Thank you for your prayers. We covet them. If you ever want to visit Rwanda, you have a home here with us.
