Doug has been working on building a Junior Secondary School. Men started digging foundation trenches on April 2, and two months later the walls are up! This is easily the fastest progress of any construction project Doug has done so far. The

plan is to have the roof done by July 5, and have all walls, floors, wiring, doors, and windows in by August 8. God has mercifully held off the seasonal rains, and that has helped tremendously. Outside the school, sidewalks are going in and landscaping and planting of grass is underway. Doug is planning on traveling back to Texas on August 8, so you can see what wonderful things can happen in the face of a deadline.
