Doug has promised to be a bit more careful (although we're not too sure that's possible).



In January, Kimanthi had a seizure that scared everyone. After giving him medication, Carolyn and Doug rushed him to the hospital where he was diagnosed with an ear and throat infection and then brought back home to Rafiki. Please pray for his recovery.
