Construction began on the Rafiki Boys' Center. It is similar in course content to the girls' center, but will teach carpentry and auto mechanics instead of the painting. Doug is overseeing construction of classroom buildings for both the girls' and boys' centers. Doug has been asked to be the boys' center director. *Pray for strength and quick learning in his new roles.*

I Can Hear!!

We want to tell you the story of four-year-old Elijah. When he came to us he seemed like an ordinary child. We did not know what a special gift he would become to us. Over the past year we noticed that Elijah wasn't progressing in speech and English. He often times looked distracted and didn't look when his name was called. Teacher Rose considered the possibility of hearing loss. Over the course of the last month he has had three hearing tests. It was discovered that Elijah had hearing loss and he was fitted with hearing aids. When he returned to Rafiki, with his new hearing aids, teacher Rose called his name. He looked at her and said "hello." Then she asked him to repeat a word and he repeated it! When Dr. Dan Pope tried to take his hearing aids off to demonstrate how to care for them, Elijah started crying. He wasn't crying because he was missing playtime. He was crying because he wanted to hear! Please pray that Elijah will continue to appreciate and protect his hearing aids. When one lives in a house with nine other children it's hard to keep everything in one piece. Please pray his speech will quickly improve. There are many tribal beliefs about deafness. One of them is that the person is possessed, cursed, or perhaps has sin in the family. We were able to teach from John chapter nine that it did not happen because of a curse or sin, but so that the work of God might be displayed in his life. We praise God for the life of Elijah and the blessing he is to us.
