SIXTEEN NEW CHILDREN AT RAFIKI

## **Answered Prayers:**

- In May of this year, we asked you to pray for another sixteen children to join the fifty-two children that were already making their home with us. We praise God because He has done just that! Sixteen seemed like a random number to pick in May, but nothing is random with God. It was in His perfect plan. Since June, we have added another sixteen children and we now have sixty-eight children calling Rafiki Village their home. Fifty-three of our sixty-eight children are in school. This summer, cottages seven and eight ("Ebenezer" and "Shalom") were opened for two new families. In November, we will open our ninth cottage ("Nazareth"). We now have space for twenty more children.
- We praise God that a new substitute mother was hired. Her name is Rose. We have been training her along with our newest Rafiki Mother, Tancy. Training should be completed in October.
- Dr. Dan Pope completed semi-annual physicals on all of our children. We praise God that our children are in very good health.
- Two of our children had new teeth growing behind other teeth. A local dentist agreed to see these girls for free. Praise God! The dentist has agreed to continue to provide free dental care for our children except for charges for medications used.

- The dryer in the ChildCare Program laundry was inoperable for almost five weeks due to a gas valve coil that melted. Praise God that He enabled Doug to make a temporary fix. We are still looking for a new gas valve coil.
- God is providing a new road to Rafiki Village. It is in process!
- The Boys and Girls Choir of Kenya has volunteered to teach our children drumming, dancing, and song.

- We praise God for His continued training of the Rafiki staff. This month our training has focused on doing jobs the Rafiki way. This includes doing our jobs with excellence, having joy, being satisfied with our jobs, and

then trusting God with the details. Pray all Rafiki staff adopt this attitude.
